
Chain Valley Bay: A Nature Lover's Dream!



Meet Ros and June, two of the "early settlers" at the Glenfern community, designed for over 50s near Port Macquarie. After both moving into the community in 2023 – Ros solo and June with her husband Rob - they are enjoying their growing friendships in this welcoming tight-knit community and are eager to embrace the experiences their new home offers.

After her husband passed away in 2021, Ros gradually decided that moving was the right step for her. She realised it wasn't realistic to keep spending time and money maintaining her large home and garden. During a drive around the area with her son, Glenfern caught her attention, and after a bit of further research, it ticked all the boxes as her new place to call home.

"I'd contemplated what I'd like to do if I was on my own, and always believed a village resort would be the right place for me," she says. "While I hadn't priced retirement living before, the affordability here was a real bonus. I thought I'd be lucky just to find a new home, but everything fell into place and was all perfect."

Originally from North-West NSW, June and her husband Rob had been living in Port Macquarie for over a decade. "The property was just getting a little bit too much for us. We saw some publicity about the Glenfern community and took a drive out here which started it all for us," she explains. The couple looked at a few homes at Glenfern, but the one they initially chose wasn't quite right for the timing of their move. Then Sue, Glenfern's Sales Manager, rang them about another home that became available, and it proved to be perfect. "We were sold on it!" June says.

Having lived near the beach in Port Macquarie for over a decade June is a keen swimmer and watersports enthusiast, and she still swims regularly – in Glenfern's pool and at the beach. It means we don't have to travel, unlike a lot of people who live in regions or smaller towns," she says.

Ros and June quickly became great friends. "June lives two doors up from me and even while I was moving in, I knew I was going

to like her. "We clicked and it was so nice to find a kindred spirit," Ros says. June and Ros both enjoy getting together with other residents for activities and special events. A recent Mother's Day function was hugely successful, attracting near-perfect attendance with residents coming together in the clubhouse for a fun-filled high tea.

Glenfern has a wide assortment of ages in its resident community making it easy to meet likeminded people of a similar age demographic. "We've got under-60s right through to those in their eighties, who don't seem at all like they're 80-year-olds, actually! I'd say between 65 and 75 would be the average", says Ros. She also adds that there's a combination of singles and couples, with some still working in interesting and fulfilling jobs like marine rescue and medical transportation.

"When I first moved in, many of the amenities were still in development, so watching everything come together has been amazing.
The clubhouse, in particular, has turned out fabulous," Ros adds.
There are opportunities to mix and

mingle daily, with activities to suit both male and female residents. Residents can enjoy coffee or drinks at the stylish clubhouse, with views over the 25m pool and bowling green. There's also a pickleball court, sports bar, cinema, and gym.

June shares that "rollups" on the bowling green set alongside the clubhouse are proving popular, with more experienced bowlers generously sharing their knowhow. 


Brush Off the Dust on the Old Gardening Tools

Mastering the Art of Simple Cooking

with Jacko from Sunrise

Welcome! My name is Bruce 'Jacko' Jackson and I live with my wife, Ronnie, at the wonderful Sunrise community in beautiful Port Stephens. I am a retired chef, and I still enjoy cooking as much as I ever have. I feel blessed to have made cooking and hospitality as a major part of my working life.

The single most asked question from people, when we are discussing cooking, is "what is your favourite dish?" There is never a simple answer as, like most people, my favorite dish constantly changes! It is my belief that food is not just for sustenance. Dining is an event that should be enjoyed as much as any entertainment event, with eating being a social event that can be enjoyed in a wide variety of locations and situations.

Now, having said all of that, I have a bit of a passion to show people how simple cooking can be if you learn a few basic techniques. For the vast majority of dishes, no special cooking equipment or fancy skills are needed. The best tool for domestic cooking is your own imagination! My current favorite dish resulted from a recent trip that Ronnie and I took to Thailand for our honeymoon. We visited Ronnie's brother who lives in the north of Thailand. There I came across

a local dish called Khao Soi and it rocketed up my favorites chart with a bullet.

Khao Soi has its roots in Chinese cooking and the modern dish has evolved to be a much-loved meal in the northern region of Thailand. Below is my version of the dish that can be easily prepared at home with readily available items and some kitchen staple foods. If you happen to be from northern Thailand, I hope that my version doesn't cause you to want to strangle me, I am merely a humble cook having a go!

Khao Soi is a noodle-based soup made with red curry paste, coconut milk and chicken stock. The ingredients for Khao Soi are very flexible as it often is in Asian cooking. It doesn't matter which protein you choose -beef, pork, chicken, and seafood all work wonderfully with this dish. My preference is for prawns. I just love prawns! The amount of red curry paste is variable depending how hot you would like the dish to be. An assortment of vegetables can be used. The standards are carrot, onion, broccoli, capsicum, and spring onions and the ratio of the veggies is up to your personal taste. Asian greens like bok choy and choy sum work really well!

Khao Soi

Ingredients

- 250g peeled green prawns (or protein of your preference)
- 1 tablespoon red curry paste (medium heat)
- 1 can coconut milk
- 500ml chicken stock
- 300g egg noodles (Hokkien Noodles are great)
- 2 carrots
- 1 broccoli
- 1 onion
- 1 capsicum
- ½ cup chopped spring onion
- ½ cup chopped bok choy or choy sum
- Neutral oil for frying

Method

Step 1/ Pour 1 glass of wine, any will do. It's not for the dish, it is for you to drink while cooking!

Step 2/ To prepare for the cooking, chop all the vegetables into any shape that you like. As the vegetables need to be stir fried, the size of the veggie should be guided by your preference for crunch. Prepare the prawns or thinly slice the protein of your choice.

Step 3/ Prepare your noodles as per the packet directions.

Step 4/ In a large saucepan, heat a couple of tablespoons of the frying oil until it just starts to smoke. *Sip on your glass of wine.

Step 5/ Fry the prawns, or your choice of thinly cut protein that you are using, until just cooked. Remove the prawns and set aside, cover to keep warm. Add oil to the pan and then add the red curry paste, fry it on a medium heat, being careful to not burn the paste.

Step 6/ Add the veggies and stir to coat all of them with the paste. No need to be too fussy, you are just trying to quickly warm them. *Sip your wine. Return the prawns to the saucepan and add the coconut milk and chicken stock. Bring it to the boil quickly for one minute and you are done!

Step 7/ To serve, place some of the noodles in a large soup bowl and ladle the soup, prawns and veggies over the noodles. If you want to get a bit cheffy, slice some spring onion on an angle and sprinkle over the soup. Drink the last bit of your wine and enjoy!

Remember the process is what makes the dish, it is your imagination that makes it yours. Be inventive. Enjoy!


