

"There is strong demand for affordable housing in this part of the world due to the areas rising prices. We are helping downsizers to retire in this beautiful area, at a price point below the typical suburban home here on the peninsula, or in Adelaide," said Kerry.










favourite books to share with the group and discuss. This year we also introduce guest speakers being local authors to attend and participate in a Q&A – which has been great.


What do you enjoy most about the book club?
