

Land Lease Homes: Affordable Options for Over 50s

After a chance meeting with a Sunrise resident at a café, the Dollmans decided to investigate what life could look like living within a land lease community.

Soon after, the couple sold their three-bedroom family home in Port Stephens, and purchased a new two-bedroom home at Sunrise for around half the price where they have been happily living for the past two and a half years and enjoying the many benefits of living in the Sunrise community, located in Port Stephens north of Sydney.

This equity release allowed Mr. Dollman to sell his kitchen installation business and bring forward his retirement by three years. What's more, the Dollmans saved a further \$20,000 due to the fact the land lease home did not attract stamp duty. "Financially, it was probably the best move we ever made," said Mrs. Dollman. "Relocating to [Sunrise] has definitely given us the freedom to start our retirement, and to be able to do a lot more in retirement."

An Affordable Alternative

Many Hometown Australia land lease community residents have followed the same financial journey as the Dollmans. Land lease communities work on a model where homeowners purchase the homeand then enjoy a long-term and secure lease over the land on which it stands. As no actual land is changing hands, the home's cost is usually far less than comparable homes in the surrounding area.

This financial benefit is extended by the fact no stamp duty or council rates, and no exit fees, are payable. Residents also retain all capital gains when they decide to sell their home. Residents pay a weekly site fee, however if the resident has a social security benefit (such as the aged pension) then this can be offset with Commonwealth Rental





Assistance. Land lease homes are playing an increasingly important role responding to the affordability challenges faced by Australians aged over 50.

Australia's Affordability Challenge for Over 50s

Recent studies have illustrated the scale of this challenge. According to a 2019 Australian Housing and Urban Research Institute report, by 2031 only one in four Australians aged 55-64 will be outright homeowners, down from one in two in 2016. Since this report has been prepared, the issue with housing affordability has worsened. CoreLogic's Hedonic Home Value Index for July 2024 shows that regional property prices have increased by 52%, and capital city prices by 33%, since the onset of COVID-19.

This means more Australians are entering retirement with the need to find affordable housing, so they can enjoy retirement without a mortgage or paying rent. Land lease communities are filling this void.

Hometown Australia Homes

At the Sunrise community, existing homes are currently available for \$700-900,000. There are more than 60 Hometown Australia communities across New South Wales, Queensland and South Australia, with many of these communities in retirement hotspots such as the Sunshine Coast, Gold Coast and Port Stephens. Typically, these homes are available for less than the price of homes in surrounding suburbs.

Life at Sunrise

The Dollmans say they are using their secure financial position to enjoy the best of life, both within and outside the Sunrise community. Within Sunrise, Mr. "Financially, it was probably the best move we ever made. Relocating to [Sunrise] has definitely given us the freedom to be able to do a lot more in retirement."

Mrs Dollman Resident at Sunrise Dollman is a keen tennis player against some of the other 190 community residents. He has also taken on the mantle of driving the community bus to allow himself, and fellow residents, to enjoy a range of activities and events in the Hunter Valley.

Other community facilities include a clubhouse, indoor and outdoor swimming pool, gym, bowling green, and vegetable garden. The Dollmans also make use of the available caravan parking spaces, and Sunrise's proximity to the upgraded Pacific Highway, to undertake 'grey nomad' style trips around Australia. "If we went away from our previous home, the thieves would know we're on the road because the caravan has gone missing from the driveway," said Mr. Dollman. "Here, it's a gated community, so there is no issue at all. We've been away for eight months and not had a single problem."

The Dollmans spent this eight-month period circumnavigating Australia in their caravan, including stopping off to cage dive with great white sharks at Port Lincoln in South Australia and swim with whale sharks at Exmouth in Western Australia. Closer to home, Mrs. Dollman is a keen diver around the Port Stephens region, while Mr. Dollman is more likely to enjoy snorkeling.

Spreading a Little Ray of Sunrise this Christmas



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Bob's Very Special Glazed Ham

With over 40 years' experience as a Chef and in the catering industry, delivering delicious food to hungry residents at the annual Sea Winds Christmas Party is not only a breeze but a pleasure to long standing resident, Bob.

Bob shared his very special glazed ham recipe to inspire readers Christmas cooking for next year. This is a very special Christmas recipe to Bob as it was his grandmother's recipe. Enjoy!

Ingredients

- Whole or half ham (cooks' preference!)
- 1 ¼ cup brown sugar
- 1/3 cup pineapple juice
- ¼ cup orange juice
- ¼ teaspoon whole cloves
- 3 tablespoons Dijon mustard

Method

Step 1

Preheat oven to 160 degrees. Place an oven shelf in the lowest position and remove all other shelves. Line a large baking dish with 2 layers of non-stick baking paper.

Step 2

Prepping the ham: Carefully run the knife around the edge of the ham skin, gently run your fingers under the skin and lift the rind off in 1 piece whilst leaving the fat. Score the fat in a diamond pattern, about 5mm deep. Stud the centres of the diamonds with cloves. Transfer to prepared dish.

Step 3

The glaze: In a large pot combine the brown sugar, pineapple juice, orange juice, cloves, and dijon mustard, bringing to the boil and stirring. Simmer until glaze thickens slightly. Poor one-third of the glaze over the ham and save the rest of the glaze for basting every 15 minutes – it is a labour of love!

Step 4

Bake the ham in the oven for 2 hours, basting every 15 minutes. This technique will ensure you get the thickest, stickiest, most caramelised glaze all over your ham.




